Apply for a [Community Energy Management Program Grant](#)

- This grant program provides financial assistance for communities to improve energy management and accelerate the implementation of energy efficiency and renewable energy. Grant funding is available to local governments, tribal governments, and other public-service entities for energy-related projects. The maximum grant award is \$100,000 per applicant. [Grant applications are now being accepted through December 31, 2024.](#)

Get ready for the Michigan Home Energy Rebate Program

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Pre-register for Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program Funding

- In 2023, Michigan was awarded about \$1.5 billion in BEAD Program funding to be allocated across the state through a subgrantee process. Over the past year, the State has been working on an [action plan](#) for use of these funds. Details about the sub-grant process for administering these funds can be found [here](#) and in [this webinar](#). A [pre-registration process](#) is strongly recommended and is now open for interested applicants to learn more about the application process and be ready to apply. Eligible subgrantees include non-profit organizations, public-private partnerships, and local governments.

Watch for information coming soon about grants to address environmental quality issues in Detroit,

- including stormwater runoff and untreated stormwater. The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments was awarded over [\\$4 million](#) to fund grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$300,000 addressing these issues, with a priority for disadvantaged communities. A webinar about the project will be held in January 2025, and grant applications can be submitted beginning April 1, 2025. Watch for more details about this opportunity [here](#).

Get ready for the launch of the Great Lakes Environmental Justice Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program

- The Midwest states in EPA's Region 5 will be distributing \$40 million in grant funds in the coming months. Applications for funding are expected to open in the Fall of 2024. [Eligible projects](#) include those addressing air and water quality monitoring and improvements, stormwater system issues, environmental pollutants, job training, disaster preparedness, and healthy homes. 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Explore new job opportunities created through the Inflation Reduction Act

- [Up to 600 jobs](#) are expected to be created in Detroit manufacturing electric vehicle battery systems. A U.S. Advanced Manufacturing Center will be established on Piquette Street. [Fortescue](#), the company leading this initiative, reportedly plans to offer training opportunities and to hire Detroit workers.
- An electric vehicle charging technology manufacturer is establishing an office in Detroit's Corktown. The office is expected to create [45 new quality jobs](#). The City of Detroit is working with [Detroit at Work](#) to assist with training support and recruitment.
